The primary function of this position is to implement both organisational and departmental clinical systems. To assist the Head of Projects and the Project team in the support of hospital's ICT programme. Securing and managing the implementation of new systems. The post holder will work as part of the ICT projects team in St. Vincent's University Hospital. The post holder will report to the Director of ICT in St Vincent's Healthcare Group and directly report to the ICT Head of Projects or nominee.

Key Duties and Responsibilities:

Assist in maintaining awareness of the Mission and values throughout the Hospital in relation to all Information Technology activities. Provide support to the Head of Projects and the Director of ICT in their goal of delivering the ICT programme by project managing the lifecycle of new systems implementation.

Specific Duties and Responsibilities:

- Plan and oversee the delivery lifecycle of complex technical projects, ensuring they align with hospital objectives and patient needs.
- A strong technical background is essential, including implementation experience across hardware, software, integrations, and infrastructure components in a clinical setting.
- Work with subject matter experts and key stakeholders in defining and gathering requirements.
 ICT projects within SVUH entail input from subject matter experts from a cross section of the
 Hospital who become part of the project team. The project manager must coordinate the tasks to
 be carried out by these multidisciplinary team members
- Translate business needs into technical requirements and apply process improvement methodologies where relevant.
- Liaise with vendors and manage their contracts, including Support Level Agreements.
- Apply international best practice and proven project delivery methodologies in a clinical setting, ensuring quality deliverables, on time and within budget.
- Ensure appropriate change control processes are in place to manage project scope.
- Mitigate risks, proactively manage and track issues, actions and decisions.
- Ensure all deliverables are of a high standard and develop Quality Assurances practice ensuring robust accepted testing is completed and signed off before go-live.
- Excellent communication and presentation skills with the ability to present to senior stakeholders, conduct demonstrations, and clearly articulate technical concepts to non-technical audiences.
- Proactive, enthusiastic can-do attitude, finding resolutions to any challenges.
- Communicate effectively with all project stakeholders. The project manager must clearly explain the project goals as well as each member's tasks, responsibilities, expectations and feedback.
- Proven ability to prioritise high-impact items, manage complex tasks, and communicate decision-making processes clearly.
- Develop Project charters/Business Cases, as well as feasibility studies when required as part of the procurement/tender process
- Specify and procure systems following defined procurement processes
- Input into contingency, business continuity and training plans.
- Where necessary define and assist in system reporting requirements, data validation and the development of supporting policies.
- Carry out post implementation reviews ensuring maximum benefits have been achieved based on benefits outlined in the project charter.

- Any other duties as assigned.

Probationary Period: The appointee shall hold office for a probationary period of six months – The Hospital's Probation and Induction policy will apply.

Pension Scheme: The candidate will be entered into one of the Hospital Superannuation Schemes.

Working Hours: The person appointed will work a basic 35 hour week. You will be required to work the agreed roster / on call arrangements advised to you by your line manager. Your contracted hours of work are liable to change between the hours of 8am – 8pm over seven days to meet the requirements for the extended day services in accordance with the terms of the Framework Agreement. (Reference HSE HR Circular 003/2009). Flexibility on hours of attendance in response to service needs will be a requirement.

Prospective candidates must satisfy themselves as to their eligibility to be employed applying / competing for posts to be filled through this recruitment campaign.

Abatement of Pension (Section 52 of Public Service Pensions Act 2012): Where a person who is in receipt of a Public Service Pension (e.g. retired on voluntary age grounds) is subsequently appointed to another Public Service post, the Abatement of Pension Regulations apply. Shortlisting: Shortlisting will be carried out on the basis of information supplied on your curriculum vitae. The criteria for shortlisting are based on the requirements of the post as outlined in the Person Specification. Failure to include information regarding these requirements on your CV may result in you not being called forward to the next state of the recruitment process.

All overseas qualifications must be validated. No candidate can work in the Hospital without validated qualifications. If professional registration is also a requirement, candidates must provide documentation of same.

Canvassing will automatically disqualify.

Please note that you will be contacted mainly by mobile phone and email. It is important that your mobile phone number, postal address and email address are correct. It is your responsibility to ensure that you have access to your mobile voice mails and emails. We recommend that you use an email address that you have regular access to.

Competency based interviews follow the shortlisting stage of the recruitment process. Credit is awarded by the interview panel to candidates who demonstrate at interview that they possess the experience, competencies and skills listed in the person specification. Candidates will normally be given at least one weeks' notice of interview. All interviews are held in person unless it is specifically noted otherwise in the Job Description. No subsequent or alternative dates to dates given will be offered to candidates. All posts are located in St. Vincent's University Hospital, Elm Park, Dublin 4 unless it is specifically noted otherwise in the Job Description.

Disability: Please let us know if you need any special assistance at interview, e.g. if you have difficulty in moving up or down stairs or have hearing or speech difficulties.

Candidates are notified of the result of their interview at the earliest possible date after the interview. The recommendation of the interview panel does not constitute a job offer. The process continues after the interview and includes clearance checks such as references, Garda clearance, overseas police clearance (if applicable)*, occupational health clearance, validation of qualifications and experience. A job offer is made pending satisfactory clearances. SVUH reserves the right to remove candidates from specific recruitment panels and retract job offers if satisfactory clearances cannot be obtained or are deemed unsatisfactory.

* If you lived in any country for 6 months or more from the date of your 16th birthday other than the Republic of Ireland or Northern Ireland you will be required to provide security clearance for each jurisdiction in which you have resided. Your security clearance must be dated AFTER you left that country and cover the entire period of your residence.
