#### **Department Information:**

The Emergency Department at St Vincent's University Hospital is part of St. Vincent's Healthcare Group and provides a regional service with St. Columcille's and St. Michael's Hospitals for patients in the Southeast Region extending from inner South City Dublin to Wexford and West to mid Wicklow. The catchment area population is approximately 435,000.

The primary function of the department is the assessment, resuscitation and treatment of acute illness and injury in patients by appropriately trained and experienced staff as quickly as possible, according to current international, national, and local standards.

The Emergency Department comprises the following:

- Triage
- Rapid Assessment and Treatment (RAT) area
- Zone 1 (Resuscitation Area)
- Zone 2 (Treatment Area for major cases)
- Zone 3 (Ambulatory Care area)
- Zone 4 (Isolation area)
- Decontamination room
- Mental health Assessment room
- Radiology suite (CT and plain film x-ray)
- EDITH (ED in the Home service)
- OPRAH (Older Persons Rapid Assessment Hub)

Following assessment and management, patients are admitted, transferred to another hospital or discharged home. After discharge patients are followed up by their General Practitioner or through specialty clinics on the hospital campus.

The Emergency Department leads the organisational response to a Major Emergency declarations. (General Services Ref: Major Incident Plan).

The department leads on the provision of EDITH (ED in the Home, initially a Slaintecare funded project) and OPRAH (Older Persons Rapid Assessment Hub, a Spark innovation funded project) both of which involve provision of multi-disciplinary care for older patients in order to access alternative care pathways where appropriate to avoid ED attendance and/or hospital admission. EDITH brings advanced frailty expertise into patients' homes avoiding the risk inherent with acute hospital presentation, in line with Slaintecare principles.

The EDITH service has established strong links with CHOs, St Columcille's and St Michael's Hospitals as well as the National Ambulance Service, local GPs and residential care units which enables bidirectional flow and efficient use of resources.

The region has a higher-than-average proportion of elderly patients with significant medical comorbidities. The surrounding area is well served by a network of good general practitioners thus patients referred to the Emergency Department or attending with emergency problems tend to be of high acuity and dependency.

The Emergency Department provides emergency post exposure prophylaxis following potential infectious disease exposures for staff out of hours. In office hours the Occupational Health Department provides this service to hospital staff.

A trauma access protocol is in operation with all major traumas from the region being brought primarily to St. Vincent's University Hospital Emergency Department. The hospital has been designated as a Trauma Unit under the National Trauma System framework.

A regional stroke service is in place with Acute Stroke cases being brought to St. Vincent's University Hospital.

The department plays an important role in undergraduate Emergency Medicine Education. The department has a track record in middle grade education being recognized as a training centre for doctors in Core and Advanced Specialist Training as well as those applying for ASTEM training positions. We also provide training to basic specialty training in medicine and supervise General practice trainees from three local training schemes.

#### **Retrieval Service Information**

The National Ambulance Service (NAS) is commissioned by the Department of Health (DoH) and the Health Service Executive (HSE) to operate the critical care retrieval service, known as – National Ambulance Service Critical Care Retrieval Services (NAS CCRS).

NAS CCRS is a service within the NAS whose aim is to deliver a comprehensive critical care retrieval system that:

- is available to all infants, children and adults within Ireland
- is integrated with and supports the integration of Model 2, 3 and 4 Hospitals
- provides bi-directional inter-facility transport for patients with complex life threatening illness or require life sustaining medical equipment
- prioritises clinically urgent as well as non-clinically (system) urgent patients
- supports cross programme participation and collaboration

Through the use of dedicated retrieval teams and more timely transfers, patient outcomes will improve; patient flows will be improved and acute tertiary beds will become more available when needed, thus decreasing lengths of stay, reducing morbidity and mortality.

The ultimate goal is to have a responsive 24/7 retrieval service for Adults, Paediatrics and Neonates, with the ability to repatriate patients back to regional centres, to ensure they receive care as close to home as is possible.

MICAS is currently a 7 day per week, 8am to 8pm service for the retrieval of critically ill adults. MICAS will be crucial in the support to the implementation of the trauma strategy, support of model 2 & 3 hospitals and implementation of Sláintecare.

The NAS CCRS enables hospitals to request assistance from a critical care team to be deployed to a referring hospital to support stabilisation and transfer of critically ill patients. The aim of NAS CCRS is to bring the critical care treatment to the patient, providing rapid access to critical care interventions and safe transfer of these patients to the most appropriate centre.

The service offers a single point of contact – 1800 222378 (1800 ACCEPT) for all hospitals who require support from NAS CCRS. It facilitates advice calls and has the capacity to conference multiple users in one call and can bridge in relevant specialists as required.

#### **Key Duties and Responsibilities:**

- To participate in development of and undertake all duties and functions pertinent to the Consultant's area of competence, as set out within the Clinical Directorate Service Plan<sup>1</sup> and in line with policies as specified by St. Vincent's University Hospital.
- To ensure that duties and functions are undertaken in a manner that minimises delays for patients and possible disruption of services.
- To work within the framework of the hospital and/or levels of service (volume, types etc.) as determined by St. Vincent's University Hospital. Service planning for individual clinical services will be progressed through the Clinical Directorate structure or other arrangements as apply.
- To co-operate with the expeditious implementation of the Disciplinary Procedure.
- To formally review the execution of the Clinical Directorate Service Plan with the Clinical Director / Employer periodically. The Clinical Directorate Service Plan shall be reviewed periodically at the request of the Consultant or Clinical Director / Employer. The Consultant may initially seek internal review of the determinations of the Clinical Director regarding the Service Plan
- To participate in the development and operation of the Clinical Directorate structure and in such management or representative structures as are in place or being developed. The Consultant shall receive training and support to enable him/her to participate fully in such structures.
- To provide, as appropriate, consultation in the Consultant's area of designated expertise in respect of patients of other Consultants at their request.
- To ensure, in consultation with the Clinical Director, that appropriate medical cover is available at all times having due regard to the implementation of the European Working Time Directive as it relates to doctors in training.
- To supervise and be responsible for diagnosis, treatment and care provided by non-Consultant Hospital Doctors (NCHDs) treating patients under the Consultant's care.
- To participate as a right and obligation in selection processes for non-Consultant Hospital Doctors and other staff as appropriate. The Employer will provide training as required. The Employer shall ensure that a Consultant representative of the relevant specialty / sub-specialty is involved in the selection process.
- To participate in clinical audit and proactive risk management and facilitate production of all data/information required for same in accordance with regulatory, statutory and corporate policies and procedures.

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- To participate in and facilitate production of all data/information required to validate delivery of duties and functions and inform planning and management of service delivery.
- Maintain throughout the Hospitals awareness of the primacy of the patient in relation to all of the Hospitals' activities.
- Demonstrate behaviour consistent with the values of the Hospitals.
- Actively participate in and promote continuing education and research activities consistent with the position.
- Promote open communications throughout the Hospitals.
- Cover for fellow Consultants during holidays, sickness or other approved absences.
- Provide a consultative service as required.
- Participate in the development of services in the hospital, including the assumption of appropriate administrative roles.
- Liaise with the Chief Executive, Director of Nursing, Chair of Medical Board, consultant staff and others in all matters pertaining to the efficient management of the hospital services.
- Perform such other duties appropriate to his/her office as may be assigned to him/her from time to time.
- Advise on the development and maintenance of Gastroenterology services within the resources of the hospital and in co-operation with management.
- Manage, as required, patients in ICU
- Encourage and support research and development.
- Organise and participate in the teaching of undergraduate and postgraduate students, Nursing and other staff of the hospital.

#### **Specific Duties of Post:**

- The successful applicant will be expected to collaborate with the NAS CCRS and MICAS team, management and local Clinical Directors.
- The appointee will be expected to supervise, coordinate and participate in the transfer of critically ill adults. There is an expectation for on-ambulance presence, for rostered shifts. The appointee will also coordinate national MICAS operations on a shared basis with other MICAS consultants. There will be a requirement for direct and indirect supervision of paramedics, nurses and non-consultant hospital doctors. The appointee will triage and task the appropriate NAS CCRS asset and act as a resource for advice for non-NAS CCRS transfer teams. The appointee will participate in teaching and training of NAS CCRS staff and also outreach education to acute care units around the state on the management of the safe transport of critically ill patients. The appointee will be expected to participate in standard non-clinical professional activities described in the Consultant Contract on behalf of NAS CCRS.

The successful candidate will be rostered according to departmental schedules and on call rosters and in accordance with contractual obligations in the Emergency Department and with the National Ambulance Service. Consultants are required to submit a detailed practice plan outlining weekly commitment to each service, and to be signed off and approved by each service. This will be used to create a template for the weekly schedule and will allow for monitoring of duties.

The post will require 75% time commitment to the National Ambulance Service off site for the delivery and co-ordination of MICAS services, and 25% clinical time on site at SVUH. NAS CCRS funds 7.5 WTE consultants to provide MICAS, Adult Critical Care and Retrieval Services. This appointee will join others each with a 0.5 WTE commitment to NAS CCRS and a 0.5 WTE commitment to their base specialty. Services are provided with the current provision of funding 12 hrs a day, 5 days per week; taskings can

involve taking patients from hospitals nationally. There is currently no on call commitment to NAS CCRS pending reaching a critical mass of consultants nationally. When this is achieved it is envisaged that the appointee will participate in a pro rata on call roster for NAS CCRS providing initially 12/7 cover and expanding to 24/7 cover.

The above Job Description is not intended to be a comprehensive list of all duties involved and consequently, the post holder may be required to perform other duties as appropriate to the post which may be assigned to him/her from time to time and to contribute to the development of the post while in office. This document must be regarded as an outline of the major areas of accountability at the present time, which will be reviewed and assessed on an on-going basis. The Hospital Structure is currently under review and therefore, reporting relationships may change.

**Probationary Period:** A Consultant who currently holds a permanent Consultant appointment in the Irish public health service will not be required to complete a probationary period should (s)he have done so already.

A Consultant will not be required to complete the probationary period where (s)he has for a period of not less than 12 months acted in the post pending its filling on a permanent basis.

**Pension Scheme:** The candidate will be entered into one of the Hospital Superannuation Schemes.

**Working Hours:** The Consultant is contracted to undertake such duties / provide such services as are set out in this Contract and agreed work schedule in the manner specified for **37 hours** per week. To support the Employer in the delivery of extended consultant-provided services the Employee's core weekly working hours will be scheduled to occur between 8.00 am and 10.00 pm on rostered Mondays to Fridays and between 8.00 am and 6.00 pm on rostered Saturdays.

#### **Annual, Conference, Course leave:**

All leave or planned absences, other than those described in Clause 19.3 'Sick Leave', Terms and Conditions of Consultant Contract must have prior approval from the Clinical Director / Employer.

The Consultant's annual leave entitlement is 30 working days per annum and as determined by the Organisation of Working Time Act 1997.

#### Sick leave:

The Consultant may be paid under the Sick Pay Scheme for absences due to illness or injury. Granting of sick pay is subject to a requirement to comply with the Employer's sick leave policy.

#### **Travelling & Subsistence Expenses:**

Travelling and subsistence expenses necessarily incurred by a Consultant in the course of duty shall be met on the basis applicable to persons of appropriately senior status in the public sector.

#### **External Work (Private Practice):**

You may not engage in private practice on-site in accordance with the Contract Type. Please refer to Clause 24 of the Public Only Consultant Contract 2023 of the Terms and Conditions of the Consultant Contract.

#### **Medical Council Registration**

The appointee should be registered as a specialist in the Specialist Division of the Register of Medical Practitioners maintained by the Medical Council in Ireland in the specialty of **Emergency Medicine.** 

#### **Clinical Indemnity Scheme**

This post is indemnified by the Clinical Indemnity Scheme. See Clause 34 of the Terms and Conditions of the Consultant Contract.

#### **Superannuation/Retirement:**

- (a) You will be covered by the terms of the relevant pension scheme as set out is Sections 5 & 6 of DPER circular 19/2012. Appropriate deductions will be made from your salary in respect of your contributions to the scheme. In general, 65 is the minimum age at which pension is payable, however, for appointees who are deemed not to be 'new entrants' as defined in the Public Service Superannuation Miscellaneous Provisions Act 2004 an earlier minimum pension age may apply.
- (b) Should you be deemed not to be a new entrant (as defined in the Public Service Superannuation (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 2004), retirement is compulsory on reaching 65 years of age.
- (c) Consultants newly appointed on or after 1st January, 2013 or persons returning to public service employment after a break of more than 26 weeks will be members of the Single Public Service Pension Scheme. The Single Scheme provides for CPI-linked defined-benefit pension awards based on career-average pay. Minimum pension age will be linked to the State Pension age (66 years initially, rising to 67 in 2021 and 68 in 2028). Pension benefits for new entrants will accrue on a standard basis (i.e. one year's credit for one year's service up to a maximum of 40 years' service) while normal abatements of pension provision will apply to all public sector posts. Compulsory retirement age for most members will be 70 years.

#### **Additional Information**

#### St. Vincent's University Hospital

St. Vincent's University Hospital is a 660 bedded teaching hospital. The catchment area has a population of approximately 435,000 people and is situated in Dublin Mid Leinster/South Dublin Hospitals Network. The hospital provides a comprehensive range of medical, surgical, radiology, pathology and other services for this region and, at the present time for some areas outside it.

The hospital is part of the teaching facility at University College Dublin, and undertakes undergraduate and postgraduate teaching and training. The appointee will have the opportunity of participating fully in all the research and academic activities of the Department of Emergency Medicine and will be encouraged to develop their own research interests. They will also be expected to participate in teaching with special emphasis on undergraduates. The appointee will be a member of the Medical Board of St. Vincent's University Hospital.

The appointee will have full access to all the academic facilities available at the St. Vincent's University Hospital site and through its association with the School of Medicine and Medical Sciences, University College Dublin.

#### **Confidentiality:**

During the course of employment staff may have access to, or hear information concerning the medical or personal affairs of patients, students, staff and / or other health service business. Such records and information are strictly confidential and unless acting on the instruction of an authorised officer, such information must not be divulged or discussed except in the performance of normal duty. - The successful interviewee must be registered as a Specialist in the relevant specialty on the Specialist Division of the Register of Medical Practitioners maintained by the Medical Council of Ireland before taking up appointment. The candidate will be allowed a max of 180 calendar days from date of interview to secure this registration and produce evidence of special interest training where relevant.
- Should the successful candidate not be registered as a Specialist at that time, the post may be offered to the next suitable candidate (or, in the case of HSE posts, the Public Appointments Service may choose not to recommend that candidate to the employer). Should no suitable candidate exist, a further recruitment process may be initiated.
- The employer may decide to make a proleptic appointment(s) as provided for at Section 2 d) of Consultant Contract 2008.

**Shortlisting:** Shortlisting will be carried out on the basis of information supplied on your curriculum vitae. The criteria for shortlisting are based on the requirements of the post as outlined in the Person Specification. Failure to include information regarding these requirements on your CV may result in you not being called forward to the next stage of the recruitment process. Canvassing will automatically disqualify.

Please note that you will be contacted mainly by mobile phone and email. It is important that your mobile phone number, postal address and email address are correct. It is your responsibility to ensure that you have access to your mobile voice mails and emails. We recommend that you use an email address that you have regular access to.

Competency based interviews follow the shortlisting stage of the recruitment process. Candidates will normally be given at least two weeks' notice of interview. All interviews are held in St. Vincent's University Hospital, Elm Park, Dublin 4 unless it is specifically advised otherwise.

Candidates are notified of the result of their interview at the earliest possible date after the interview. The recommendation of the interview panel does not constitute a job offer. The process continues after the interview and includes clearance checks such as references, Garda clearance, occupational health clearance, validation of qualifications and experience. A job offer is made pending satisfactory clearances. SVUH reserves the right to remove candidates from specific recruitment panels and retract job offers if satisfactory clearances cannot be obtained or are deemed unsatisfactory.

For some recruitment competitions a panel of successful candidates may be formed as a result of the interviews. Candidates who obtain a place on the panel may, (within the life of the panel), be considered for subsequent approved vacancies. Candidates are placed on a panel in order of merit.
